Mullum Mullum Creek

The Mullum Mullum Creek flows for 22km and is one of Maroondah's largest waterways, and a significant wildlife corridor and tributary to the Yarra River.



It is one of the only watercourses in metropolitan Melbourne that is surrounded by native and regenerated bushland for almost its entire length.

Along the creek you will find many indigenous plants and vegetation, including:

- Swamp Gum (*Eucalyptus ovata*)
- Silver Wattle (*Acacia dealbata*)
- Common Cassinia (*Cassinia aculeata*).

In Maroondah, it is home to the native water rat (Rakali); with platypus regularly sighted downstream.

The Mullum Mullum Creek Trail

You can enjoy all the Mullum Mullum Creek has to offer by walking or riding along the Mullum Mullum Creek Trail.

The trail runs from Deep Creek Road, Ringwood to Highland Avenue, Croydon with access points including:

- Oliver Street
- Rupert Street
- Leonard Street
- Sonia Street
- Glen Cairn Avenue
- Jeffrey Drive
- Highland Boulevard
- Chesney Drive
- Strathfield Parade.

You can walk the Cultural Heritage Trail, between Rupert and Leonard streets in Ringwood, to learn more about the indigenous plants of the Mullum Mullum Creek.





How to care for the Mullum Mullum Creek

Litter and pollutants that enter the creek impact on the health and quality of the water downstream to the Yarra River and Port Phillip Bay. By putting litter in the bin and cleaning up after pets you can help to ensure the Mullum Mullum Creek is one of Maroondah's cleanest environmental and recreational areas.

Be a responsible pet owner

The most common type of litter along the Mullum Mullum Creek Trail is dog waste.

To make sure the creek remains healthy, please carry appropriate receptacles, such as a bag, pouch or pooper scooper, to remove and dispose of dog waste.

Mullum Mullum Creek Trail is a shared pathway, where dogs must always be kept on a lead.
